# Bee-grade space welcome

THERE is a buzz in West Perth.

A bee-friendly parklet has been created on Colin Street by community groups and the City of Perth.

It has been inspired by Bee Scene – a West Perth Local and WA Loves Nature initiative – and the seating emulates natural beehives, while flowering plants have been used to support the bee population.

It features an urban lounge, tables and pod seats, as well as planter boxes providing screening from traffic.

Existing street trees will

provide shade.

West Perth Bee Scene is aimed at not only conserving native bees but also activating the streets of West Perth.

“Originally I was a bit nervous about losing valuable parking space on Colin Street, but now that the parklet is built and installed we couldn’t be happier,” West Perth Local chairman Steve Wellard said.

Parklets have been used around the world to enhance street amenity and create community vibrancy by repurposing carpark bays.



## Gin tour the tonic

WITHOUT the prevailing aroma of the humble juniper berry – sourced from a conifer – you can't call it gin.

That key aroma is one of the few universal rules governing the liquor and after that, the producers can really add what they want.

"We uncover some of the fun facts and interesting stories from gin's past and present, and highlight secrets, scandals and interesting stories about Perth along the way," Boucher said.

## City bid to make Australia Day open for all

THE City of Stirling is exploring options to hold a public Australia Day event in 2021 as other councils seek to move away from celebrations on the day.

Councillors voted this month for the City to investigate hosting New Year's Eve and Australia Day events, either solely

funded or in partnership with other organisations.

Cr Keith Sargent brought the item to council because the City did not provide or sponsor any public events for either occasion.

A council report said events celebrating Australia Day were "socially and politically contro-

versial" because of many Indigenous people's "mixed feelings" towards the day.

But it said the City's invitation-only citizenship ceremony held last month at Stirling Civic Gardens was "a particularly successful event" and a potential public event could "capitalise

on the investment of infrastructure" provided for this, citing the City of Wanneroo's inaugural Wanneroo Festival following its citizenship ceremony.

A subsequent report to council will investigate event options for potential inclusion in the 2020-21 budget.

# Alert on council finances

WEAK procurement processes pose as much of a risk to the City of Perth as terrorism, leaving the beleaguered council exposed to fraud and corruption.

The City's procurement processes have been identified by its audit and risk committee as a high risk, on a par with protecting the public from terrorism or maintaining public health.

A review in November had labelled it as an extreme risk with inadequate controls, but a report to this week's committee meeting said it had been downgraded to high. Its controls were also deemed adequate.

A new procurement plan is expected to be completed by July. In the meantime the City is using specialists from the WA Local Government Association to manage high risk requests at a cost of \$8554 for each tender.

A fraud and corruption control plan was scheduled to be completed by January but has been moved back to next month.

Concerns around the City's procurement practices were highlighted during questioning of past and current City officials as part of the Inquiry into the City of Perth.

The Inquiry was told the City's procurement activities amounted to about \$50 million a year, but current chief executive Murray Jorgensen said the City's financial systems looked like a "spaghetti diagram" when he started after the council was suspended.

"On one hand, I suppose it would have been almost disbelief but then on the other hand it was, well, that now explains a lot," Mr Jorgensen told the Inquiry.

"Despite the confusion that it created, it was at least comforting to know we understood the extent of the problem and now we have got a financial transformation and an information transformation program to address this."

He said he had grave concerns "every time" he was asked to sign off on a tender or a contract because he was not confident in their evaluations or the procurement process.

An officer had been appointed to "steer the ship in the right direction" before the council was suspended but Mr Jorgensen said he had left out of frustration.

The officer has since been reappointed.

"I just think there's significant opportunities for savings and better procurement and ultimately better delivery of services," Mr Jorgensen said.

Former corporate services director Robert Minich told the Inquiry there was a high level of risk with procurement.

The Inquiry was told the City had held several investigations into alleged misconduct by officers. Mr Minich said guidelines had set out requirements and he believed they were "fairly well understood".

"However, I think its possible weakness was it was largely a self-reporting regime," he said.

# Wright move on Highgate

WORK has started on a \$15.5 million apartment complex in Highgate. Integrated property and construction group Pindan has been appointed to build the seven-storey development at 66-70 Wright Street as a syndicated project managed by Perth property investment group Momentum Wealth.

The Wright Street Apartments project, designed by Perth-based Scanlan Architects, features 35 one-, two- and three-bedroom apartments and two basement levels.

Pindan general manager Simon Greenlaw said the development would be a great addition to Highgate.

Momentum Wealth development manager Phil Anderson said the boutique development would enhance Highgate's reputation.

"This landmark project

will help strengthen Highgate's value as a quality and desirable suburb, in turn helping to meet growing buyer demand for high-quality apartment product in prime inner-city locations," he said.

Construction is expected to be finished by mid next year.

## School's in for upgrade

A \$4 million upgrade of Mt Lawley Senior High School has started.

Premier Mark McGowan, Education and Training Minister Sue Ellery and Mt Lawley MLA Simon Millman turned the first sod to mark the start of work earlier this month.

The upgrades include a two-storey building for science, technology, engineering and maths (STEM), a state-of-the-art engineering workshop, two science laboratories and two general purpose classrooms.

The upgrades support the school's STEM

programs and will include a Mechatronics Studio where students will use the latest laser-printing technology and 3D computer-aided design. The new facilities will be built by BADGE Constructions.

Mr Millman said upgrading Mt Lawley SHS

was one of his election commitments.

"When complete, these will be state-of-the-art facilities that will allow local Mt Lawley students to learn STEM subjects and be placed to take advantage of the jobs of the future," he said.

## Extension for Jardine

ONE of Perth's highest paid and longest serving council chief executives has had his contract extended.

Stirling councillors voted at this month's meeting to give Stuart Jardine another two years in the top job, taking him through to April 2023.

Mr Jardine was appointed in 2007, making him one of the longest serving current chief executives in Perth. Cockburn chief executive Stephen Cain took the job in 2004 and Daniel Simms, who recently had his contract extended to 2024, has led Wanneroo since 2008.

The trio can be paid above what is set out under the Local Government Salaries and Allowances Act because they were appointed before October 19, 2011.

Mr Jardine will continue on his \$392,212 annual remuneration package, which comprises \$325,379 base salary, superannuation and contribution, car use value and professional



membership fees.

Mr Cain and Mr Simms have higher base salaries, earning up to \$379,000 and \$369,000 respectively.

The other biggest earner is Joondalup chief executive Garry Hunt, whose total remuneration per year is \$379,352.

Stirling Mayor Mark Irwin said the extension would "continue the City's stability" and he looked forward to continuing his strong working relationship with Mr Jardine.











"This is a strong endorsement of Stuart's standing within the sector and his performance for the community of Stirling," he said.

"We all look forward to working together over the next three years to deliver the strategic community plan and ensure a high level of service for everyone who chooses to work, live and recreate within the City."

A QUOTE by Mother Teresa was all Fremantle artist Lauren Elise Kennedy needed to inspire her Aspiring 2020 exhibition work titled *Nurture*.

"The theme of the exhibition was what you wish for the future to make it a better place," Kennedy said.

"Originally I wanted to do something about sustainability but then I came across Mother Teresa's quote 'If you want to

change the world, go home and love your children' and it really resonated with me.

"I think parents or guardians of young children need to work on raising people who are loved and cultured, especially in those early years, so we can instil good morals like respecting ourselves, others and the planet. After all, they'll be making the decisions in the future for our existence."

The mother of two daughters, Lottie (3) and Sage (2), said she thought

many would be able to relate to her artwork of a baby in the arms of their mother, painted in acrylic and ink.

"I want people to feel the love," the ECU graduate said.

"It sounds really corny but we need more love in the world and for people just to slow down and be present to take the time to nurture our children."

Kennedy was invited to take part in the exhibition where eight artists created their work live in Raine Square during Jan-

uary. The pieces are now displayed in the Windows of Wentworth on the corner of Murray and William streets. They will be auctioned online, closing April 1, with proceeds to Raine Medical Research Foundation.

"It's a wonderful initiative to raise money and a good opportunity for artists to showcase their work," Kennedy said.

"It was nice to be out in the community because as artists we work alone a lot, which can be quite isolating."

# Clubroom conflict

MT Lawley residents are at odds over plans to build clubrooms at a local park.

The City of Stirling has fielded complaints about noise and parking from residents along North Street for 10 years coming from clubrooms at Hamer Park, which is used by the Mt Lawley Amateur Football Club and the Mt Lawley Inglewood Cricket Club.

It released a plan last April to move the clubrooms to the opposite side of the park on Woodsome Street, opposite Mt Lawley Senior High School.

The proposal will see the football club moved to Moyle Pavilion at Inglewood Oval and Mt Lawley Inglewood Junior Football Club to Hamer Park.

But the location was scrapped after backlash from Woodsome Street residents and the high school. The City then proposed four other locations.

A report to the February 11 council meeting said the majority of respondents preferred option C, which

proposed moving the clubrooms further into the park, but noted many still picked the initial location.

People from both sides of the park packed the meeting, where North Street resident Delia Quinn said 62.5 per cent of people who lived within 400m of the park supported the original plan.

Neighbour Richard Biegel argued the Woodsome Street clubrooms and carpark would be 200m from the nearest house, compared to 75m between homes and the clubroom and 10m from the carpark.

Steve Liebich, who lives on Woodsome Street, supported the proposal because he said moving the clubrooms further into the park and relocating the senior football club would provide a "much better environment and less disturbance".

Council approved the plan, with councillor Suzanne Migdale saying the City had run a "robust consultation process" over the past two years and option C was a "clear favourite".

## Dim view of restaurant health standards

A PERTH dim sum restaurant has copped a \$40,000 fine for failing to maintain standards of cleanliness. Ausunshine Pty Ltd was convicted on January 30 for multiple breaches of the Food Act at Dragon Palace Chinese Restaurant in Northbridge. The WA Health Department fined the business \$40,000 and \$2636.40 in costs. The business was initially found to have failed to maintain food premises and

equipment to a standard of cleanliness between January 18 and 25 in 2018. The business was also convicted of failing to take all practicable measures to eradicate and prevent pests between January 25 and March 2 in the same year. The WA Health Department convicted the business for repeated instances of these offences throughout 2018. More breaches relating to cleanliness were found by the WA Health Department

from March 2 to September 13, including failing to maintain a supply of soap at hand washing facilities and failing to store the food in a way it was protected from the likelihood of contamination. Other breaches include failing to store potentially hazardous food under temperature control and failing to maintain equipment in a good state of repair. Dragon Palace Northbridge was contacted for comment.

### Seasonal weed control notification

**Weed invasion threatens the biodiversity of our conservation reserves and affects the function, community use and amenity of our public spaces.**

The City uses an integrated approach to weed and pest management. This means when chemical-free weed controls are not effective or feasible, the City selectively uses herbicides and pesticides.

Seasonal weed control using herbicide Glyphosate will be conducted from March 2020 to the end of June 2020 (weather permitting) as follows:

- Glyphosate will be applied in accordance with label directions and best practice from the Western Australian Department of Health to road kerbs, footpaths, public access ways and traffic islands throughout the City
- Application will cease in wet or windy conditions and nozzle protection shrouds will be used to minimise spray drift
- Weed spraying vehicles will have clear signage showing ‘Slow Moving Vehicle, Spraying in Progress’ and display the Contractor’s name.

# New speed limit for Beaufort

A TRIAL to reduce the speed limit along Beaufort Street is going ahead after more than 15 years.

Stirling councillors voted to approve the two-year trial at their February 11 meeting. The new speed limit of 40km/h will be set between Central Avenue and Crawford Road in Inglewood.

The City of Stirling has been seeking the speed reduction since 2004 but had been refused by Main Roads until 2018.

Cr Bianca Sandri said there had been lots of lobbying to achieve the trial, which she believed would add value and a “better vibe” to Inglewood.

“Approving this is saying thank you to the community of Inglewood,” she said.

But Crs David Boothman and Elizabeth Re were concerned 53 per cent of survey respondents opposed the reduction, though Cr Sandri argued the community was

“strongly for” it.

A report by City officers said it normally required a minimum of 50 per cent support to proceed but deemed the “relative closeness” of survey results and potential road safety benefits sufficient to go ahead.

Inglewood resident Gordon Wyre told the meeting it was a “dangerous prece-

dent” to ignore the community’s wishes and believed the change would create rat-runs through the area.

Infrastructure director Michael Littleton said a report following the trial would determine if rat-running occurred and the current operating speed of Beaufort Street was marginally above 40km/h.

"The sessions weave in and out of poetry and music, each offering the audience an insight into the different forms that poetry


inhabits in today's world," she said.







THE City of Perth's free annual Opera in the Park event returns to Supreme Court Gardens on February 22, when WA Opera will immerse the audience in the world of *Hansel and Gretel*.

The popular opera by German composer Engelbert Humperdinck brings the Brothers Grimm fairytale to life while media artist Sohan Ariel Hayes, who worked on Boorna Waanginy, will transform the park into a forest with projection, light and imagery.

Ashlyn Tymms and Pia Harris are playing the title characters of Hansel and Gretel respectively in the concert performance, the two singers relishing their roles and Tymms continuing the tradition of Hansel sung by a mezzo soprano.

"It's great getting to play a child because generally as a woman your part is either about going crazy or being in love, which is a fine line," Mt Pleasant soprano Harris said.

"It's such an important event for Perth and WA Opera because our version of this opera is so inclusive that everyone can enjoy it.

"We are all excited and just wish we could do more than one performance. I feel like it's a winner and it's going to be amazing."



## Fun on the fly

THERE was fun, frivolity and epic falls when the Birdman Rally hit Perth's shores, with thousands flocking to watch competitors try to fly in the name of charity.

The annual community event in the '70s and '80s challenged people to travel 50m in an unpowered aircraft and the entrants' crazy antics – as well as their spectacular flops – made for great entertainment.

Yanchep resident of 43 years Tom Darcey said the Channel Seven initiative at Two Rocks Marina attracted a crowd of 16,000 in 1978 at a time when just 1800 people lived between Yanchep and Two Rocks.

"It was one big party and the amount of money injected into the town on that one day would have been phenomenal," Mr Darcey said.

"The crowd was unbelievable; you could just

about walk across the boats in the marina."

He said the army built a huge ramp as a launching pad for the contenders, some dressed in novelty costumes or sporting a home-made contraption.

"At one of them, they set a 1965 Falcon station wagon on fire and drove it off the end," he said.

"I don't know if that car is still in the marina; I presume not.

"A lot of people tried flapping their arms and just fell off the end – they had lifesavers at the bottom – but there were a few who took it pretty seriously and had a real good go."

Mr Darcey, who operated the Two Rocks Service Centre for eight years, welded an aluminium-framed glider for then marina manager Harold Northwood to put to the test.

"I think it flew about 10 feet, if you can call it flying, so not that far at all," he said.

Contestants paid a \$10 entry fee, which was donated to Telethon, and competed to win a \$10,000 cash prize for the first person to fly 150 feet.

Local clubs also fundraised, with the Lions Club selling 200 cartons of beer and cricket clubs selling crayfish rolls "hand over fist" at the event.

The 1978 rally, which Mr Darcey attended with his wife Jan and children Kate and Paul, featured a jam-packed program including a parachute jump by SAS soldiers, surf ski jousting, personality boat race and more.

"It was the best and at the end of the day everyone on board the boats got their deck hoses out and squirted each other with water and there was all sorts of carry-on," he said.

Mr Darcey said the rally would never make a comeback due to concerns about safety and marina pollution.

# Writer wants books to make mark

WRITER and political analyst Sisonke Msimang often tells people she was born in exile to a South African freedom fighter and accountant.

As the major influences in Msimang's life, her father's desire to make the world a better place and her mother's pragmatism have shaped her thinking, right down to planning the Perth Festival's Literature & Ideas weekend.

Known as Writers Festival and Writers Week in previous incarnations, there are some aspects of the premier literary event at the University of WA that she knew better than to change while curating her maiden program.

"It operated as a festival within Perth Festival and the wonderful things about that are it's a self-contained unit, people know exactly where to go and they know how it runs every year, so the accountant in me knew it was important that stayed the same," the author of *Always Another Country* and *The Resurrection of Winnie Mandela* said during an address at the Karrakatta Club.

"But we are under pres-

sure to have a wider audience; that is very much a pressure everyone in the arts feels."

The need to attract a younger generation distracted by digital, as well as new Perth Festival artistic director Iain Grandage's focus on the topics that make societies tick and encouraging important broader conserva-

tions within the city, resulted in the addition of an ideas concept to the book lovers' fest.

"My stealth mission is to get them to books because I think books are still really important for how we engage with the world and how we are able to imagine ourselves as far more than what our immediate physical surround-

ings may allow us to think," Msimang said.

"Imagination helps build empathy and that allows you to be thoughtful rather than obsessed with the now. It does seem to me that many of the problems in the world would be a lot easier to deal with if we had people who were more thoughtful and able to slow down."

Msimang and her team spent almost a year creating a program of more than 70 free and ticketed sessions featuring about 100 writers, thinkers, journalists and comedians addressing the festival's bold themes of land, money, power and sex.

The guests are people they would invite to a dinner party for the city if

given the chance.

On this occasion, there's a "brain food" series scheduled at the University Club restaurant, including a breakfast with Peter Holmes a Court about his new memoir *Riding with Giants*.

It's also a weekend featuring panels, "slow reads" (authors reading from their own work) and a family day, plus there's a bigger space for book signings and larger pop-up book shop.

The ultimate aim is to get attendees to talk and laugh, have big conversations in ways that are fun.

This year, the sessions have increased from 45 to 60 minutes and breaks doubled to 30 minutes, allowing deeper discussions as well as more time for reflection. Literature heavy-hitters include Neil Gaiman, whose works including *American Gods* and *Good Omens* have been brought to life on the small screen.

Australian authors Charlotte Wood (*The Weekend*), Melissa Lucashenko (*Too Much Lip*), Christos Tsiolkas (*Damascus*) and Heather Rose (*Bruny*) are also part of the program. The Perth Festival's Literature & Ideas weekend runs from February 21-23.

## Thrash things out

MUSIC fans are in for a thrashing in April.

Texan punk outfit D.R.I. – aka Dirty Rotten Imbeciles – will return to Perth for a double-header thrash night at Amplifier on April 12.

D.R.I., who sold out their last run of Australian dates, will be joined by Los Angeles four-piece Hirax for their national Australian tour.

D.R.I. released its debut EP *Dirty Rotten* in 1982, which packed 22 songs into only 18 minutes. Subsequent recordings such as 1984's *Violent Pacification* and 1985's *Dealing With It* saw D.R.I. take a distinct metal direction.

Their crossover thrash sound, which

combines punk, hardcore and metal styles, won the band fans all over the world, including Slayer's Dave Lombardo, who cites D.R.I. as a major musical influence.

This will be the first time in Australia for Hirax, which cut their teeth in Los Angeles and San Francisco in the early to mid-1980s alongside bands such as Slayer, Metallica and Exodus.

Their debut was a four-song demo in 1984.

It was followed with 1985's *Raging Violence* LP, 1986's *Hate, Fear and Power* and 1987's *Blasted in Bangkok* demo.





# Taking on the impossible

PAUL McDermott regrets not paying more attention in music class during his school days, lamenting it may have helped his choices later in life.

"In Doug Anthony All-stars I used to write the lyrics and keep the melody in my head, which is a bit of a burden because I couldn't play an instrument then," McDermott said from his Bondi home.

"I can't even really play the guitar now and can only hammer a couple of chords out.

"I used to have to sing those melodies to someone else, often Richard Fidler or sometimes Tim Ferguson,

and then they would explain to me what I was doing was impossible because I'd changed key four times in the song and that the notes weren't meant to go together, and I'd tell them 'let's do it anyway'."

McDermott has a similar working relationship with Tripod's Steven Gatesy, aka Gatesy, who he has teamed up with for the show *Paul McDermott and Gatesy Go Solo*. Although McDermott has no memory of it, Gatesy insists the two first met at the Arias 18 years ago and they have since become good mates who love singing together.

Their first gig was a touching tribute to mutual friend Meria who was part

of the Melbourne comedy scene and died far too young.

McDermott wrote the song *Stone Crows* in her memory and asked Gatesy to perform it with him.

"We did the song and after that we decided to find a way to keep working together and keep singing that song; it was the thing that fused us," he said.

"It's great to have someone incredibly talented next to me because I'm just a charlatan. Gatesy brings wonderful energy, warmth and good humour to everything we do."

Paul McDermott and Gatesy Go Solo features songs, a few stories and a bit of McDermott-style dark-

ness because "there's always a dark side with the things I do".

"We have a new swag of songs we'll be bringing out over the course of this year which is exciting for both of us," McDermott said.

"There's a lot of swipes at society and the world we live in at this point in time with its incredibly unsettling politics and dubious reactions to climate and people. We do have a little bit of fun along the way and generally the shows have been incredibly well received, so we just hope to perform more."

# Gladiator unleashes hell

GLADIATOR... up there with the manliest, hairiest-chested names ever to adorn a vehicle.

On any other car it would sound comically naff, but it's a fitting title for a monstrous new Jeep.

A four-door, four-wheel-drive ute – pickup truck, more accurately – based on the hardcore four-door Wrangler SUV.

And it's no ordinary ute; at 5.5m it's 20cm longer than a Toyota HiLux, is powered by a 3.6-litre V6 petrol engine (no diesel option yet), and then there's its party trick.

You see, this American can roll into the dual-cab ute classroom, compare biceps with the Ford Ranger Raptor and Nissan Navara N-Trek Warrior, then take its shirt off.

Its hard-top panels or soft-top can be quickly removed for open-air adventuring. In places where such things are legal, you can even fold down the windscreen and remove its doors.

What this elongated Jeep represents is good old fashioned freedom with a hearty dose of cool.

Its 4x4 prowess means you and four passengers can go topless off-roading.

Its 1500mm tub is long enough to hold 95 per cent of motorcycles, while a clever bike carrier tray is on the accessories list.

It'll wade water crossings up to 760mm, and a Rubicon version with extended 4WD hardware and smarts lets you adventure deeper than arguably any other dual-cab ute.

Now the bad news.

While Jeep confirmed

Gladiator will hit showrooms by the middle of the year, it has not confirmed prices or final specification. Unlike the four-door Wrangler, it appears there'll be no entry-level Sport model; just higher-specification Overland and Rubicon.

The damage? I'd guess a Gladiator Overland should cost around \$70,000 and the Rubicon a few grand more, before on-roads.

Headlights and grille slots are inspired by the first Willys Jeeps of the 1940s, and giant flared wheel arches exude ruggedness.

What hits you is the sheer size of this Gladiator.

Tall and wide certainly, but its dramatic length is overwhelming. Tight city car parking? Good luck.

Aptly, Jeep let us loose in it and hard-core Rubi-

con versions on New Zealand's South Island. Our Gladiators were left-hand-drive, but what we drove should closely mirror Australian versions.

First surprise was on-road comfort and handling. Impressively, the Gladiator kept most road noise at bay with soft top closed, the V6 and eight-speed auto were smooth enough – punchy too, when requested – and steering felt closer to that of a normal SUV rather than a B-double.

The five-link coil rear suspension's been modified from a Ram 1500 truck's, and combined with a wheelbase with its own time zone, bumps were well mopped up, there was no fussiness to the ride and it all felt quite refined.

The top folded back in seconds (the hard top panels if optioned come off in

not much more time), but the hood doesn't pack away properly, leaving it looking like a fabric air brake on top of the roof.

We ventured into Mt Aspiring National Park – *Lord of the Rings* country – an apt Gladiator arena.

The gear shifter needed a fair old whack to move into low range, but despite our road rubber, the big Jeep bounded over big rocks, swollen rivers and challenging inclines.

Be in no doubt, Jeep hasn't diluted any ability just because this is a ute.

The descent angles and slippery rocks the Gladiator climbed were huge, and the measured, confident way it employed its 4WD hardware made the experience near effortless.

It tows 2700kg and the payload is just 620kg, but that'll suit those shopping

for a lifestyle rather than work truck.

The cabin is up to task too. Firm leather seats, soft plastic and stitched dashboard, over-sized gear shifter and door handles, Apple CarPlay/Android Auto through the touchscreen and vast, smart storage.

The Gladiator could be just the warrior Jeep needs to win hearts and minds once more.
